Antoine Arjakovsky

Antoine Arjakovsky has a Doctorate in History. He defended his doctoral thesis at the École des Hautes Études en Sciences Sociales in Paris in 2000 on "The Generation of Religious Thinkers of Russian Emigration. The Journal *The Way* (1925-1940).".

Between 1989 and 2002 he worked at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of France. He began his mission as a cooperation attaché for cinema at the French Embassy in Moscow. He was then director of the Collège Universitaire Français in Moscow. He then took the role of attaché of education cooperation in Kiev and became the co-director of the Institut Français of Ukraine. In 2004, he created and directed the Institute of Ecumenical Studies within the Catholic University of Ukraine and remains to this day Director of the Board of Directors and Senior Fellow of this Institute (About us | Institute of Ecumenical Studies).

Since December 2011, he is the co-director of the Politics and Religions research department at the Collège des Bernardins in Paris (Antoine Arjakovsky - Collège des Bernardins (collegedesbernardins.fr). He created also Agapan, a teaching program of ethical and religious culture provided by e-learning at the Collège des Bernardins between 2011 and 2015 (Conférence inaugurale - lancement de la formation continue AGAPAN.FR - Collège des Bernardins (collegedesbernardins.fr). Since 2014, he is a professor at the Ecole Cathédrale des Bernardins and gives a course on "Introduction to ecumenical sciences". In 2017, he gave a course entitled: "Wisdom as a vector of inter-religious dialogue".
